The Secretariat of the United Nations presents its compliments to Permanent Missions to the United Nations and has the honour to refer to the United Nations Uniformed Gender Parity Strategy, which aims to have at least a 25% representation of female officers in the Office of Military Affairs (OMA), of the Department of Peace Operations, by 2028.

OMA kindly requests Member States to ensure the nomination of at least 25% female officers for any given Job Opening advertised in the current recruitment campaign. For example, if a Member State wishes to nominate up to four (4) officers for a particular post, at least one must be a suitably qualified female officer. Additional nominations will only be accepted if 25% of the nominations are suitably qualified female officers.

If a Member State cannot nominate a suitably qualified female officer, they may only nominate up to three (3) qualified male officers for a specific appointment. If a Member State nominates more than three (3) male candidates without any female candidate, the first three (3) candidates in the "List of Nominees" will be considered for the recruitment campaign.
